ORDINANCE NO. 56.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE HEALTHOF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CLARA, REGULATING PUBLIC MEETINGS HELD IN SAID COUNTY, GRANTING CERTAIN POWERS TO THE HEALTH OFFICER THEREOF.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Clara do ordain as follows:

Section One: - Whenever an epidemic or when any contagious or infectious disease is prevalent in the County of Santa Clara, the health officer of said County is authorized and empowered to forbid the holding of any meeting or gathering, either public or private, and to order closed any place where meetings or gatherings are held.

Section Two:- It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, when so for bidden by said health officer to hold any of the meetings or gathering hereinabove mentioned to attend or take part in the same, or to open or conduct any place where said meetings or gatherings are held.

Section Three: Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200. or by imprisonment in the County Jail of the County of Santa Clara not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section Four: This ordinance is hereby declared to be, and shall be deemed an ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety of the County, and shall be deemed and is an urgency measure, and shall take effect and be in force fifteen days after its passage and approval.
