Railroad Assessments, SEE OLD BOOK.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 1923

The Board of Supervisors of Sanga Clara County met this day at 10 o'clock a. m. in adjourned session. Present: Supervisor, A. L. Hubbard, Chairman, Henry Hecker, John Roll, Henry M. Ayer, and C. P. Cooley and Henry A. Pfister, Clerk.

The following proceedings are had, to-wit:

Minutes of September 4, 1923 are read and approved.

The petition of M.S. Beyer and others is presented, asking for the formation of a Public highway lighting district, to be known as the Agnew lighting District, and described as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the easterly prolongation of the Southerly line of a lane 33 feet wide leading to the G.H. Kamm property with the center line of the Santa Clara and Alviso Road and thence westerly from said point of beginning along said Easterly prolongation and the southerly line of said lane to the easterly line of the 35.92 acre tract of C. H. Kamm, thence northerly along the easterly line of said tract to the line between the lands of C.H. Kamm and Alfred Brown: thence easterly along said last mentioned line to the southwesterly corner of lands of F.P. Jamison, thence northerly along the westerly line of the lands of F.P. Jamison to the Agnes Road: thence easterly along said road to a point 500 feet westerly from the west line of Fitzgerald Street as recorded on the of Bethlehem in the office of the Recorder of Santa Clara County on Map Book D, at Page 41: and running thence northerly and parallel to the west line of Fitzgerald Street, and distant therefrom 500 feet to the point of intersection with the westerly prolongation of the northerly line of the Bethlehem Tract; thence easterly along said northerly line its westerly prolongation to the center of Santa Clara and Alviso Road; thence southerly along the center line of said road to the place of beginning. Thereupon on motion it is ordered that said petition be set for hearing to Monday, October 15, 1923, at 10 o'clock a.m., and it is further ordered that the clerk be directed to give notice by posting three notices and also by publication in the Santa Clara journal once a week for two consecutive weeks of the proposed lighting district.

The following resolution is on motion unanimously adopted: Whereas, there has been submitted to the Board a map of Laurelwood Farm subdivision upon which map there is shown a projected road extending from the Kifer road to Hoffman Avenue; and, Whereas, the owners of said subdivision are desirous of improving and grading said road and opening the same to public travel: Whereas, it is necessary to secure permission of the Railroad Commission of the State of California to build said road across the right of way and tracks of the Southern Pacific Company: Now, Therefore, it is hereby resolved and ordered that it is the desire of the Board that said road be improved and graded and opened to public travel and that this Board is willing and desirous that permission to cross said railroad right of way be granted.

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Justice of the Peace R.R. Bell of Redwood Township appeared before the Board requesting that his office be furnished with a criminal code and codes needed for his office. Upon motion it is ordered that the chairman be authorized to furnish all County officers with the necessary codes needed for their office.

Applications for state aid are presented for the following named children: Lena Serio; Henen and Vista Boynton. Upon motion said applications are granted.

The Superintendent of the County Hospital reports the sale of one hide for the sum of \$2.60 and requests that said sale be confirmed. Thereupon on motion it is ordered that said sale be confirmed and the clerk directed to deposit same with the county treasurer.

Communication from J.S. Dunnigan, Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, City and County of San Francisco, is read, and upon motion ordered that resolution No. 21534, new series, relative to bridge across the Golden Gate, passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of City and County of San Francisco, be approved and endorsed by this Board as expressing the sense of this Board in said matter.

The application of the Western Union Telegraph Company is read, requesting permission to set four telegraph poles to carry clock circuit, one wire insulated No. 14 gauge, location Race Street, between Moor Park Avenue and San Salvador Street, San Jose, California. These poles 25 ft and one 30 feet. Upon motion said matter is ordered referred to Supervisor Roal.

Upon motion it is ordered that the Pacific Gas and Electric Company be requested to change the location of two poles one on Alma Road at Diss crossing and one at Grant Road near State highway.

The certificate of the resident physician and Superintendent of nurses at the Santa Clara County training School for nurses is presented certifying that Elizabeth Jean Shannon September 13, 1923; Marion V. Dae Oct. 16, 1923; Mildred S. Turner, Sept. 4, 1923; Edna Marion Grant, Oct. 16, 1923; Frances Lucy Schwalenberg, Sept. 14, 1923; Mary Anna Michel, Sept. 14, 1923; Dorothy Gladys Witmer, Sept. 14, 1923; Pearl Phoebe Swanson, Sept 14, 1923; Zella McCarl Leach, Dec. 31, 1923, have completed the term of three years at the Santa Clara County Training School for nurses, and have passed the required examination satisfactorily, and recommend that certificates be issued accordingly. Thereupon on motion it is ordered that Certificates be issued accordingly.

The application of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is presented requesting permits to open County roads for underground pipe crossing on Page Street in accordance with sketch submitted. Upon motion it is ordered that said request be granted.

The certificate of the County Surveyor is read, certifying that the following improvements have been completed on Coe Avenue. Completion of Coe Avenue By San Jose Paving Company Supervisors District No. 4, Gravel Bunker at Campbell gravel pit by Looman and Brimhall. Gravel Bunker at Los Altos, Moody Road Supervisors District No. 5 and recommend its acceptance Thereupon on motion it is ordered that said work be accepted as recommended.

\* Deed from Paul F. Clark and May R. Clark his wife; C.V. Fisher and Grace Lee Fisher his wife; W. G. Trudgeon and Ada Trudgeon, his wife; Frances J. Jones and J.P. Jones His wife; Adolph Keser, a single man; Freda Keser, single; E.H. Moody, single; and A.O. Schillerstrom and Mabel Schillerstrom, his wife conveying to the County of Santa Clara all that certain strip

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piece and parcel of land, situated, lying and being in Road District No. 4, in the said County of Santa Clara, California. Upon motion it is ordered that said deeds be accepted and the clerk directed to place the same of record in the county recorders office, by reason of the opening of said street, and Bounded and particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the southerly line of brace avenue, said point being N 50° 25' E 143.72 feet from the northeast corner of Lot 4 of the Billings Subdivision as recorded in Book N. of Maps at Page 56 in the office of the Recorder of Santa Clara Count and thence from said point of beginning S20° 18' E 324.10 feet to an iron pipe. The above described line being the center line of a strip of land of the uniform width of 30 feet, 20 feet on each side of said line and being a portion of the lands formerly of Mrs. J.H. Wythe.

The Petition of Allen A. Prior et. al. asking that California boulevard be accepted as a public County road. Supervisors District No. 5. Upon motion said matter is ordered referred to Supervisor Cooley.

On motion of County Surveyor is directed to prepare plans and specifications for the following concrete culverts: In Supervisors District No. 5, two on Alma Street and one on Magdalena Road.

Upon motion is is ordered that the cost of construction for gravel Bunker at Campbell gravel Pit, in Supervisor District No. 4 and also the construction of Bunker as Los Altos Quarry, Supervisors District No. 5, payments for said work be made from the General fund.

Supervisor Cooley, to who was referred the petition of Allen A. Prior et. al. to accept California boulevard and to declare the same a public County road. now makes reports and recommends, that said California Boulevard be accepted a public county road, Supervisors District No. 5. Thereupon motion is is ordered that said road be declared a public county road, and the name changed to Alma Street.

Plans and Specifications for the following bridges are presente by the County surveyor as follows: reinforced concrete bridges on the Uvas Road over the Uvas Creek; reinforced concrete culvert, Live Oak Avenue, near Orchard Avenue, Supervisors District No. 1 reinforced concrete culvert on Alma Street, over Barron and Adobe Creeks in Supervisors District No. 5; reinforced concrete bridge on Jackson Avenue over the Silver Creek in Supervisor District No. 2, in the county of Santa Clara, California. Thereupon on motion it is ordered that said plans and specifications be adopted, and the clerk directed to advertise for bids for the same, bids to be received on Monday, October 15, 1923, at 11 o'clock a. m.

This being the time fixed for receiving bids for supplying the County of Santa Clara with stationary for the ensuing year the following named persons presented bids: The Required checks accompanying each bid, Millard Bros., Wich and Marshall, Melvin Roberts and Howarth, Bucknell and Brazell. Upon motion is is ordered that all bids be referred to the finance committee.

This being the time fixed for receiving bids for supplying drugs to the county for a period of one year. The following bids are submitted: The required checks accompanying each bid: Wolff Drug company and C. W. Dore. Upon motion it is ordered that all bids be referred to the finance committee.

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Upon motion it is ordered that the matter of intention of the County of Santa Clara to purchase certain Rock Quarry on Alum Rock Avenue be referred to the District Attorney.

The Sheriff having recommended the same, on motion it is ordered that the sentences of prisoners in the county jail be reduced as follows: J.H. Jackson 30 days, Harry Gent 15 days; John Kelly 30 days.

Vouchers are presented by San Jose Railroads in amount of \$473.91, Vouchers Nos. 4855, 4853, 4857, covering payment of franchise tax under Santa Clara County's Ordinance "I" "J" "K" for year ending September 5, 1923. Upon motion it is ordered that the clerk be directed to deposit said sum of money with the County treasurer to the credit of the General Fund.

On motion the Board adjourns.
