

**ORDINANCE NO. 89**

**AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ENFORCING THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE EIGHTEEN OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES, PROHIBITING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, STORAGE, SERVICE, GIFT, TRANSPORTATION, IMPORTATION OR EXPORTATION, OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS FOR BEVERAGE PURPOSES; REGULATING ALL OTHER TRAFFIC IN SUCH LIQUORS; CREATING A FUND FOR THE ENFORCEMENT THEREOF; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF", AS PASSED AND ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CLARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ON THE 6TH DAY OF JUNE, 1921.**

**The Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Clara, State of California, do ordain as follows:**

**SECTION 1: "An ordinance enforcing the provisions of article Eighteen of the Constitution of the United States, prohibiting the manufacture, sale, storage, service, gift, transportation, importation or exportation, of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes; regulating all other traffic in such liquors; creating a fund for the enforcement thereof; and providing penalties for the violation thereof", as passed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Clara, State of California, on the 6th day of June, 1921, is hereby repealed.**

**SECTION 11: This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its passage and approval.**

**Passed and adopted this 3rd day of April, 1933, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Clara, State of California, by the following vote:**

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SECTION II: This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its passage and approval.


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
