ORDINANCE NO. 86

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS OF PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY AS INTERSECTIONS WHERE VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO STOP BEFORE ENTERING, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

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THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CLARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following described intersections of the hereinafter mentioned public highways in the unincorporated territory of the County of Santa Clara, State of California, are hereby designated as intersections of public highways where all vehicles are required to be stopped as hereinafter set forth before entering said intersection:

1. The intersection of Villa Street and Mariposa Avenue.  
All vehicles entering said intersection from Villa Street must come to a stop before entering said intersection.
2. The intersection of Fremont Road and El Monte Avenue.  
All vehicles entering said intersection from El Monte Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.
3. The intersection of Capitol Avenue and Alum Rock Road.  
All vehicles entering said intersection from Capitol Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.
4. The intersection of Meridian Road and Moorpark Avenue.  
All vehicles entering said intersection from Moorpark Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.
5. The intersection of Campbell Avenue and Santa Clara and Los Gatos Road.  
All vehicles entering said intersection from Campbell Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.
6. The intersection of Hamilton Road and Santa Clara and Los Gatos Road.

All vehicles entering said intersection from Hamilton Road must come to a stop before entering said intersection.

7. The intersection of Garfield Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

All vehicles entering said intersection from Garfield Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.

8. The intersection of Lester Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

All vehicles entering said intersection from Lester Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection;

9. The intersection of Glen Eyrie Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

All vehicles entering said intersection from Glen Eyrie Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.

10. The intersection of Coe Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

All vehicles entering said intersection from Lincoln Avenue must come to a stop before entering said intersection.

11. The intersection of McKee Road and King Road.

All vehicles entering said intersection from King Road must come to a stop before entering said intersection.

Section 2. No person shall drive any vehicle into any of the intersections designated in Section 1 of this ordinance without immediately prior thereto causing such vehicle to come to a stop as hereinbefore provided; provided, however, that the provisions hereof shall not apply at intersections where and at times during which traffic is under the immediate control of a traffic officer.

Section 3. The terms vehicle and intersection as used in this ordinance shall be and are as defined in the California Vehicle Act, Chapter 266, Statutes 1923, and acts amendatory thereof.

Section 4. Any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor and punishable as follows, to-wit: For a first conviction thereof within one year, by a fine of not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or by imprisonment in the County Jail for not to exceed five (5) days; for a second such conviction within one year, by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment in the County Jail for not to exceed ten (10) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a third such conviction within one year, by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the County Jail for not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published with the names of the members voting for and against the

same, for one week in a newspaper published in said County of Santa Clara.
