LEGAL.

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PROTECTION OF FISH AND GAME IN THE COUNTY OF SANTA CLARA, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of Supervisors of the county of Santa Clara do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, capture or in any manner to destroy or to have in his or her possession, within the limits of this county, any mountain or valley quail between the first day of February and the first day of November of each year.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person within the limits of this county to kill or take more than twenty quail or wild duck in any one day, or to have in his or her possession more than twenty quail killed or taken by one person in one day, or more than twenty wild ducks, killed or taken within the limits of this county in any one day by any one person.

Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than twenty dollars or more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term of not less than one month or more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall not be applied to cases where the State Game and Fish Commissioners have granted permission for the propagation of any of the game enumerated in this ordinance.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force fifteen days from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PRESERVATION OF QUAIL AND PROVIDING PUNISHMENT FOR THE UNLAWFUL TAKING, KILLING AND TRANSPORTATION THEREOF FOR MARKET.

The Board of Supervisors of the county of Santa Clara do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons from and after this ordinance is passed and in force and effect to take, kill or transport any species of quail for the purpose and with the intent of marketing the same.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any wholesale or retail dealer from and after the time this ordinance is passed and in force and effect to buy or sell quail for the purpose of trade.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any common carrier from and after the time this ordinance is passed and in force and effect to accept for transportation or to transport any quail delivered to said common carrier for the purpose of shipping the same to market.

Sec. 4. Any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is hereby declared a misdemeanor, and any person adjudged guilty thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed sixty days, or be punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances of said county in so far as they conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force fifteen days from and after its passage.
